Blast mines, M/969	146	On February 25, 2004, part of the stockpiled APMs was destroyed by detonation at the military training base. In total 146 APMs were destroyed through detonation in two parts. After the destruction of the first batch of 70 APMs, placed in a dug out specially prepared for this purpose, the second batch of 76 AMPs was destroyed. Representatives of the Ministry of Defense, the National Army, Media, Members of the Inter-departmental Commission on APM and the Representatives of the ICBL, the International Red Cross, the OAS and the Honorary Consul of Canada in Suriname have attended the destruction proceedings.
