# Reporting for time period 01/01/2017- 31/12/2017

In 2016 The Humanitarian Mine Action Programme which started in 2012 ended and it was announced that the following three NGO's have been selected for the Mine Action and Cluster Munitions Programme 2016-2020: The Halo Trust, Mines Advisory Group (MAG), and Danish Church Aid (DCA). With the support of a total of  $\notin$  45 million euro Dutch funding from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs these three organisations will be able to continue helping to create a landmine-free world in 14 different countries: Afghanistan, Colombia, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Iraq, Lebanon, Libya, the Palestinian Territories, Mali, Somalia, Syria, South-Sudan, Kosovo, Yemen and Ukraine. Of this total amount  $\notin$  10 million euro is reserved for emergency response. During the period 2016-2020 the HALO Trust, MAG and DCA will actively contribute to the clearing of landmines, dismantling production and storage facilities and destroying stockpiled landmines. They will also offer support to victims and their families (including rehabilitation and reintegration), and educate the local population about the risks and dangers of (land)mines. In addition, the Netherlands provides an annual (unearmarked) contribution to the UNMAS Voluntary Trust Fund.

The total contribution in 2017 from The Kingdom of the Netherlands to NGO's and multilateral organisations for Humanitarian Mine Action was **EUR 16.523.771**. The contributions listed below are from both programmes.
