In 2023, the Brazilian Army has approved the manual for demining and cleaning of the area, which regulates the process of cleaning an area contaminated by explosive devices, framing missions that may have a humanitarian character. This manual establishes cleaning control standards, in addition to define the criteria for the implementation of the cleaning process on the Brazilian Army Activities.
