¹ Notes on using the cover page:

1. The cover page could be used as a **complement** to submitting detailed forms adopted at the [First and Second] Meetings of the States parties in instances when the information to be provided in some of the forms in an annual report is the same as it would be in past reports. That is, when using the cover page, only forms within which there is new information would need to be submitted.
2. The cover page could be used as a **substitute** for submitting detailed forms adopted at the [First and Second] Meetings of the States parties only if all of the information to be provided in an annual report is the same as in past reports.
3. If an indication is made on the cover sheet that the information to be provided with respect to a particular form would be unchanged in relationship to a previous year's form, the date of submission of the previous form should be clearly indicated.

State [Party]: **The Republic of Poland** reporting for time period from **01 JAN 2014** to **31 DEC 2014**

Poland has always supported international community's efforts to deliver assistance to post-conflict recovery areas and has contributed to the alleviation of the humanitarian problem caused by unexploded ordnance and landmines, particularly within various peacekeeping and stabilizing missions abroad (e.g. in the EU - EUTM mission in Mali and NATO - ISAF mission in Afghanistan). Personnel of the Polish Armed Forces have executed tasks for the benefit of local populations additionally to their mandatory tasks. The activities have included among others removal and destruction of mines and other explosive remnants of war (in cases of emergency), as well as providing warning and risk education to the affected communities.

At the reporting period 48 Polish deminers were directly involved in demining and clearing activities in missions abroad. They identified and destroyed the following amounts of dangerous items:

- Under the auspices of EU - EUTM Mali:
 - 16 pcs of artillery and mortar munitions;
 - 14 pcs of hand and anti-tank grenades;
 - 4 pcs of unexploded ordnance;
 - 41 pcs of various types of munitions.
- Under the auspices of NATO - ISAF Afghanistan:
 - 2 pcs of air bombs;
 - 501 pcs of artillery and mortar munitions;
 - 946 pcs of hand and anti-tank grenades;
 - 17 909 pcs of various types of munitions;
 - 44 pcs of elements of EOD;
 - 1 456 kg of explosives.
