<p>Following Zambia's compliance in 2009, no new contaminated areas have been discovered.</p>				<p>A nationwide landmine survey was undertaken from September 2008 to August 2009 in 7 of Zambia's 9 provinces which were suspected to contain mines. The survey identified 35 SHAs in 25 wards with 12 of these areas being roads used by freedom fighters and 21 former military camps, military positions or battle areas. Of the 35 SHAs, all 12 road segments were released. During the survey 13 spot tasks were conducted, destroying 2 submunitions, 21 items of AXO/UXO and 2 other explosive devices.</p> <p>The survey methodology utilized teams of multi-skilled surveyors and included techniques such as primary opinion collection, non-technical survey, false negative sampling and false positive sampling.</p> <p>The survey determined that there were no minefields or mined areas. Zambia declared itself a mine free country in accordance with Article 5 of the Convention on 13 November 2009.</p>

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

[Narrative:]

All areas were cleared and the sensitisation and Risk education programmes have continued in an effort to raise awareness among affected communities on the dangers of landmines. The Mine Risk Education Teacher’s and Learner’s Handbooks were finalised during the year under review and are still awaiting translation into local languages; publication and distribution. Funding is being sought for the translation, publication and distribution exercises.
