

# Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on Their Destruction

#### UPDATE ON THE STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF ARTICLE 4

Article 4 requires each State Party to destroy stockpiled AP mines "as soon as possible" but not later than four years after the entry into force of the Convention for that State Party.

The attached table provides an indication of progress being made in the implementation of this Article and the deadlines for implementation. The following key is used:

States Parties that have completed stockpile destruction, have never held mine
stockpiles or if Article 7 information has not been made available are presumed to not
hold stockpiles (based upon other information sources).
States Parties that are in the process of destroying stockpiles or, if Article 7 information
has not been made available, are presumed to have extremely small stockpiles (based
upon other information sources).
States Parties that have not begun stockpile destruction or, if Article 7 information has
not been made available (or has not yet been required) are presumed to possess
stockpiles and have not yet begun destruction.

This table demonstrates both that implementation of Article 4 is proceeding at a good pace and that some challenges remain:

• By March 1, 2003, 45 States Parties will be required to have completed stockpile destruction. Of these States, 12 are in the process of destroying stockpiled AP mines, have not yet begun stockpile destruction or have not provided sufficient information on whether stockpiles are held:

By the end of 2003, 38 additional States Parties will be required to have completed stockpile
destruction. Of these States, 16 are in the process of destroying stockpiled AP mines, have
not yet begun stockpile destruction or have not provided sufficient information on whether
stockpiles are held:

Note: The purpose of this document is to provide an overview of progress in implementing Article 4. The Convention contains provisions for this information to be provided by States Parties through Article 7, which requires each State Party to report annually on "the total of all stockpiled anti-personnel mines owned or possessed by it, or under its jurisdiction or control, to include a breakdown of the type, quantity and, if possible, lot numbers of each type of anti-personnel mine stockpiled."

In many cases, however, Article 7 information has not been made available or is not up to date. In these situations, the Co-Chairs have made use of the best available information, which in many cases is contained in Landmine Monitor. The Co-Chairs apologize in advance for any errors or omissions and would request that updates be provided to the Co-Chairs in order that corrections can be made.
