In order to implement the Anti-personnel Mine Ban Convention Article 5; enhancing the capacity of personnel is critical. Hence, the FDRE Government is working extensively to develop the capacity of manpower in the mine action training center with the collaboration of different organizations as follows:-

1. IED course training conducted by Americans
 - i. First round
 - phase 1 from 19 Dec-07 Oct 20016 for 20 personnel at Entoto training center
 - phase 11 from 21 November -09 December 2016 for the same personnel at the same place
 - ii. Second round
 - phase 1 from 08-24 February2016 for 20 personnel at Entoto training center
 - phase 11 from 10-28 April 2017 for 19 personnel at Entoto training center
2. using internal capacity
 - i. basic demining course from 10- 30 June 2016 for 412 personnel in Fiche, Semera, Shire and Enticho sites
3. EOD level 2 course conducted by ICRC from 6-31 March 2017 at Entoto and Awash

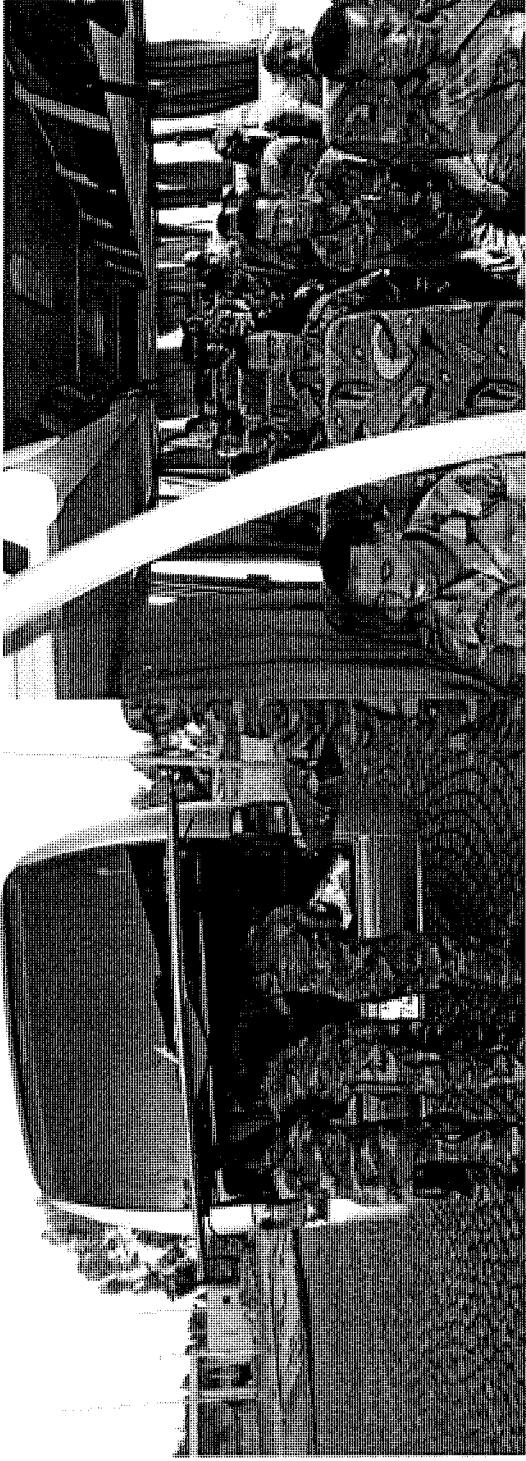



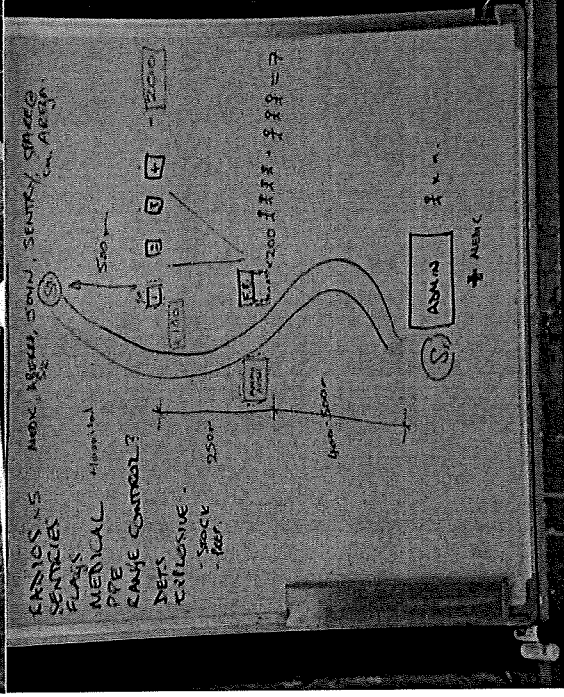

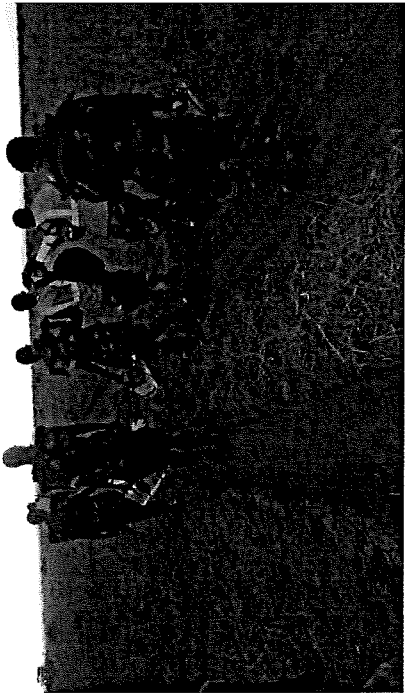

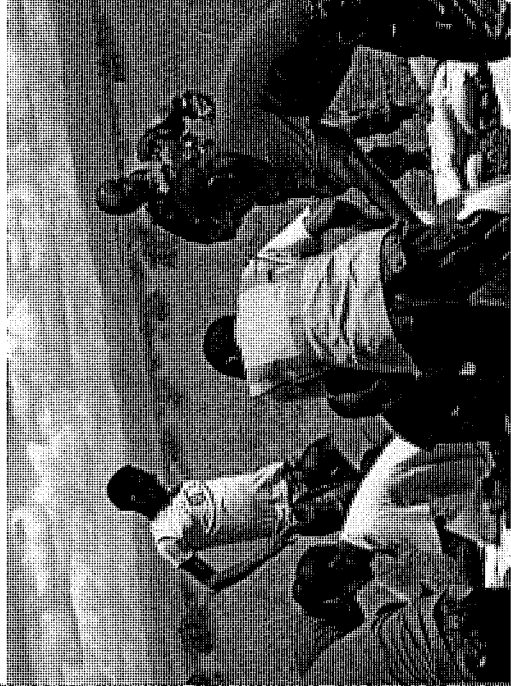

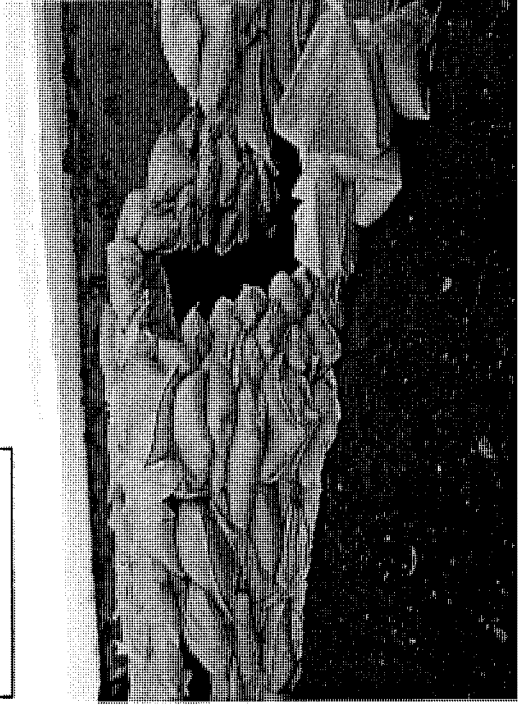

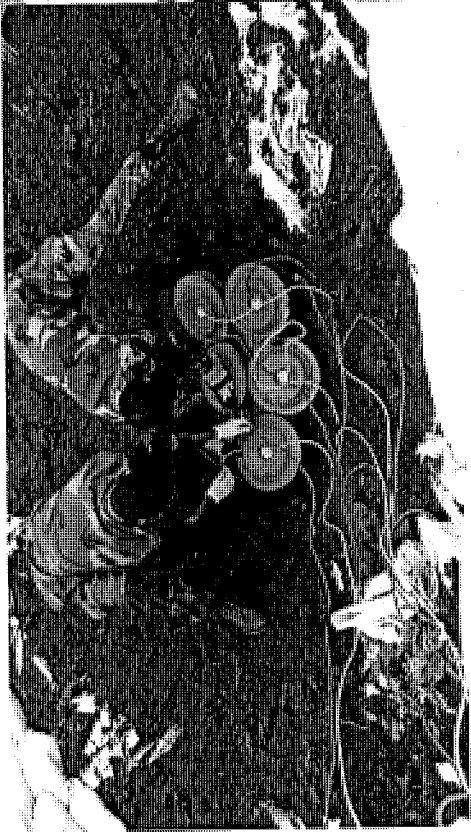
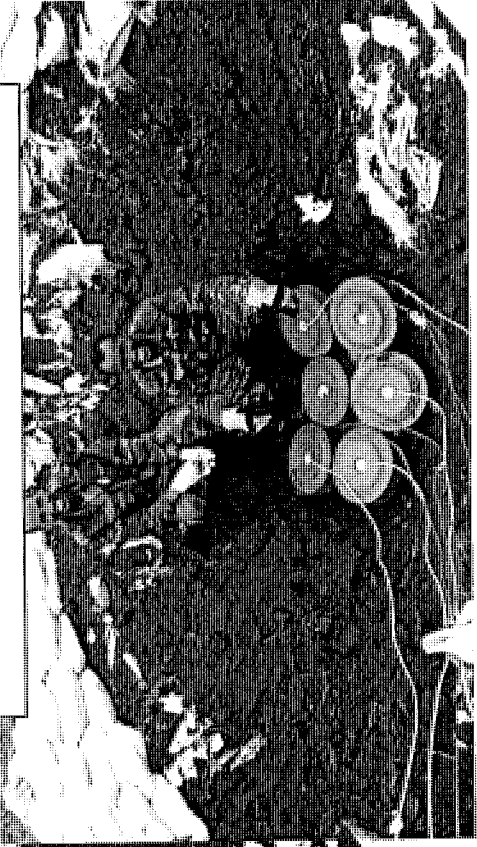

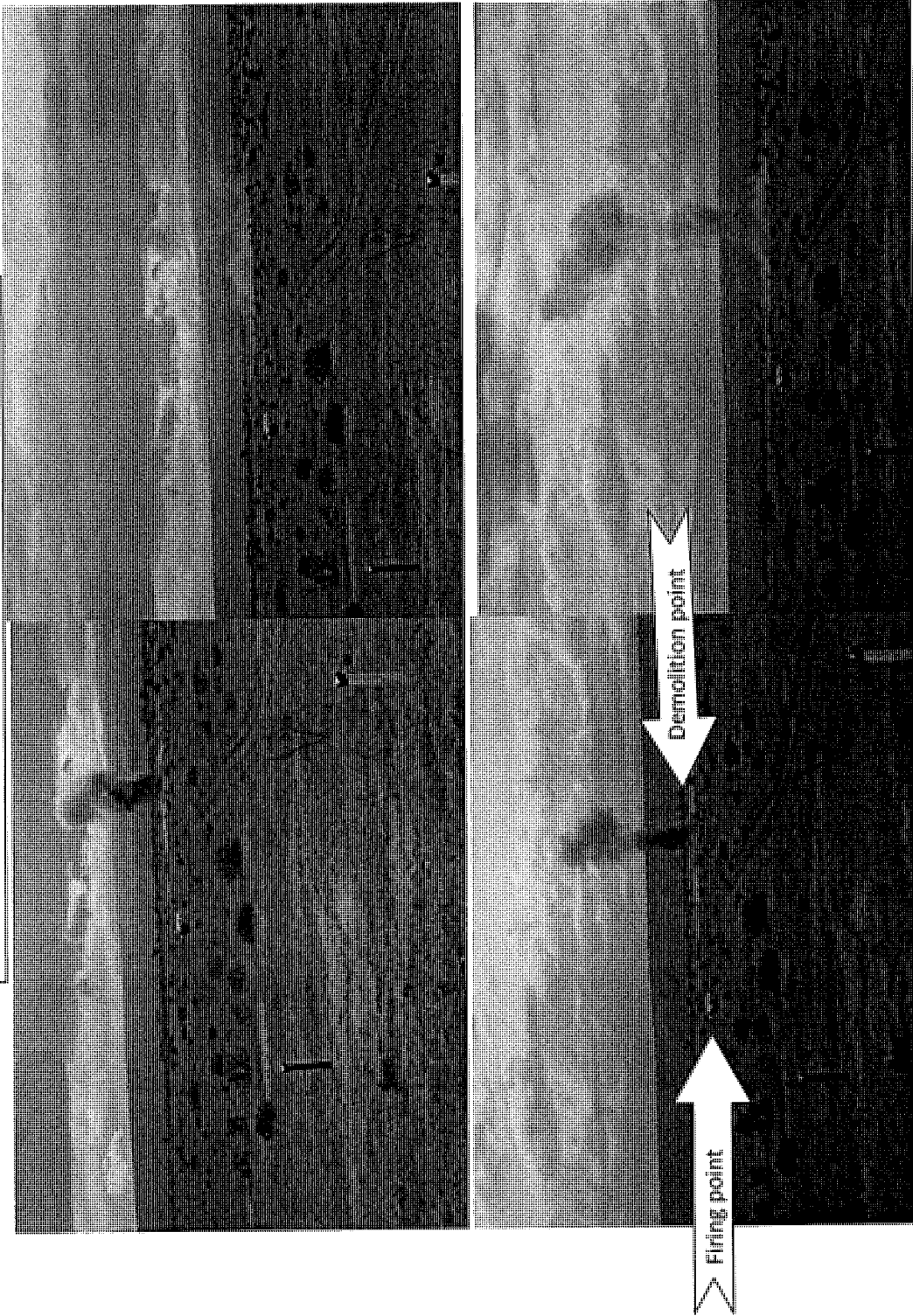

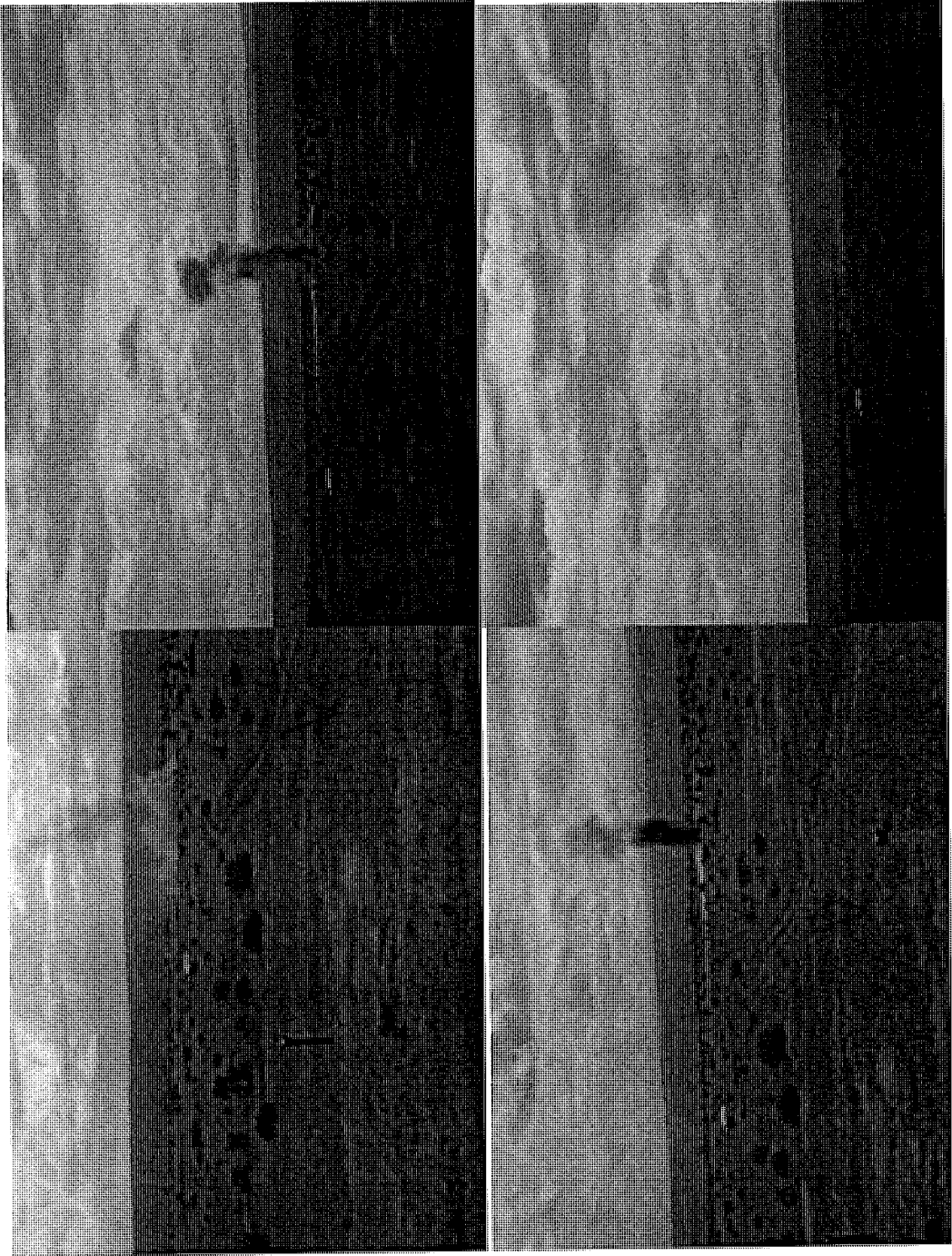
